From New Haven: I-91 North or the Merritt Parkway to Rt. 691 West towards Waterbury. Take Exit 4

(Southington). Take a right at the end of the exit. At the bottom of the hill (McDonald's is on the corner), take a right onto South End Rd. Follow until you come to Mulberry St. on the left,

the Aqua Turf is on Mulberry St. approximately ¼ mile on your left.
